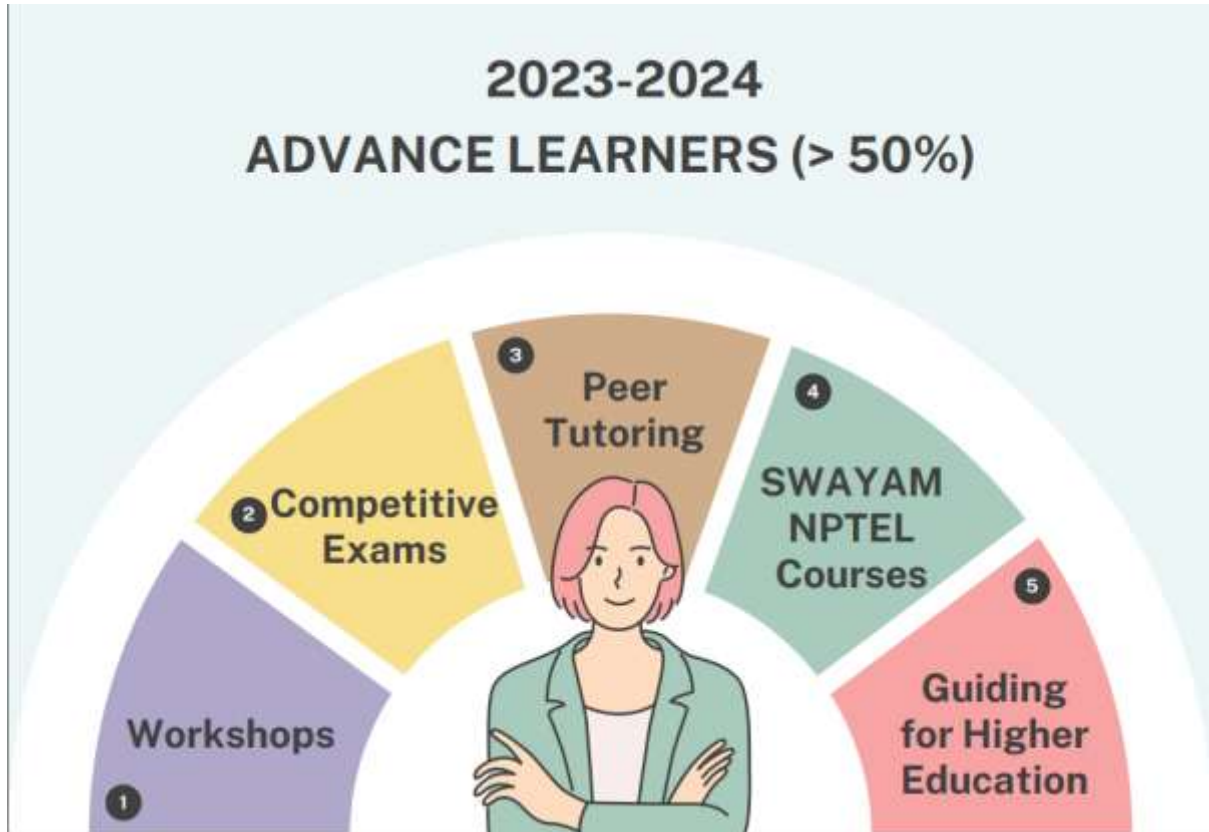

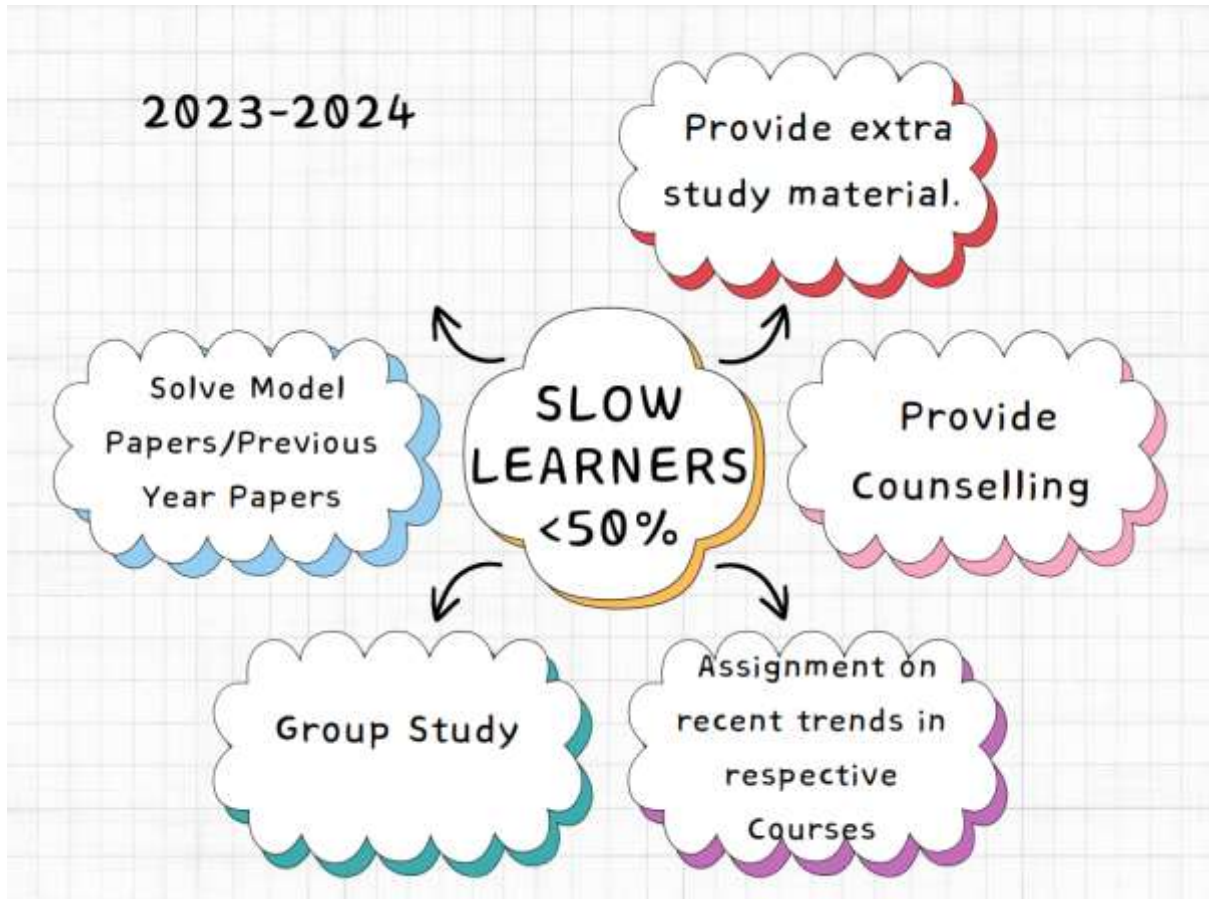

- Positive reinforcement and Encouragement - recognizing and celebrating the progress and achievements of slow learners as it can boost their confidence and motivation. It helps cultivate a growth mindset and a willingness to persist despite challenges.

12. Teaching methodologies

1.Commerce

The Teaching Pedagogy in the Department of Commerce is Student centric. The Department uses a cutting-edge "blended approach" to deliver the Curriculum designed by Osmania University. This approach includes the creation of activities based on inputs from industry and academia, classroom instruction combined with application-based pedagogy, continuous internal evaluation, student feedback and further improvisation of teaching methods.

Students are given opportunities to enhance on their practical learning through Field Visits, Edu venture trips, Group Discussions, Quizzes, Debates, Seminars, and Guest Lectures & Skill Development Certificate Programs.

The faculty applies modern teaching aids, e – learning resources and ICT enabled teaching. The Faculty and students participate in various seminars, workshops for getting exposure in advanced knowledge.

Revision is an approach which is deeply rooted in subject knowledge and explicitly teaches and guides students to effectively perform in the examinations and also sustain subject command over time. Exam Oriented Question Banks are prepared and provided. Guidance to slow learners is given by tutorial and remedial classes.

Faculty judiciously evaluates the student performance through tests by setting benchmarks for continuous academic performance. The advanced learners are given innovative projects thereby preparing them to become employable and industry ready.

Feedback mechanism is adopted to evaluate the quality of teaching.

The Teaching Pedagogy includes:

- a) **Lectures:** The students' understanding of the course content is greatly aided by the application of teaching tools like traditional Chalk and board method, Power Point presentations, Flipped Classroom and you tube videos in classrooms.
- b) **Commerce Lab:** To provide practical exposure of the process, procedure and practices followed by organizations in conducting commercial practices, students are exposed with all forms, formats and documents in the Commerce Lab. Students are equipped with practical knowledge and entrepreneurial ability in the Commerce Lab.
- c) **Bridge Courses:** The Department conducts a Bridge Course in all the courses offered during the first month of Semester 1, to give students the confidence and skills to successfully transition to college and new curriculum. A curriculum is framed separately in each course.
- d) **Case Studies:** Simulation Exercises are incorporated in the Teaching through Case Studies wherein the ILAC Approach (Issue, Law, Application and Conclusion) are applied in Simulation.
- e) **Continuous Internal Evaluation:** Unit tests & Pre-Final Examination.

- f) **Assignments:** Assignment from every unit of syllabus is given. Quiz is conducted at the end of every Unit to assess and review the extent of understanding of the Unit.
- g) **Guest lectures & Alumni Lectures:** Industrial experts, Faculty from Universities and Alumni are invited to give guest lectures and seminars.
- h) **Industrial Visits / Field trips:** Industrial Visits and Field Visits are organized for students to familiarize with the procedures and norms that control contemporary business.
